

## Citizen Circle

Focuses on nine domain areas:

1. Employment-Work and the role of work in the person's life, including education and vocational skills;
2. Education-Education and vocational skills desired;
3. Family/Marital-Being with family members and the support an offender derives from them;
4. Associates/Social Interactions-Positive Interaction with community members and non-criminal associates with the opportunity for positive interaction with peers;
5. Substance Abuse-Living without reliance on alcohol and/or other drugs;
6. Community Functioning-Knowledge and skills for daily living, including safety, an acceptable place to live, health, personal budgeting, leisure activities, and the use of social services;
7. Personal/Emotional Orientation-Decision-making, coping with stress, and practicing mental health and wellness activities.
8. Attitude-Supporting law-abiding behaviors
9. Involvement with Faith Community

Citizen Circles create partnerships that promote positive interaction and accountability for offenders upon release. Circle members address risks that contribute to criminal activity by taking ownership of the solution. Offenders seek involvement with a Citizen Circle voluntarily. The Citizen Circles meet on a regular basis to discuss offender's progress, review plans, interview new applicants, and admit new members and to discharge both successful and unsuccessful offenders.



The Mid Ohio Reentry Coalition was formed as part of a community based partnership between the local court system, mental health and substance abuse treatment, law enforcement, corrections, human services, business and interested persons. The goal was to create community change for those individuals returning to the community from the prison system and to reduce recidivism. Mid Ohio Reentry drew from the vision of the Ohio Reentry effort to create opportunities for offenders to successfully connect to communities and become productive members of society.

## MARION AREA COUNSELING CENTER REENTRY SERVICES



The goal of reentry is to assist persons being released from prison or a Community Based Correctional Facility to establish and maintain recovery with a focus on mental health and substance abuse treatment. Case management support services are provided as a primary means of support. Resources and supports will: Reinforce adjustment back into the community, teach skills to minimize recidivism, and establish a sober/healthy lifestyle. Thinking for a Change classes take place over an 11 week period with two classes per week.

## OPENING DOORS



**Identify:** Offenders who will be returning to Marion or Crawford counties from any Ohio prison. Any offenders returning to the Marion - Crawford counties area before 10/31/2011 are eligible.

**Recruit:** Collect information. For those soon to be released we seek to inform and refer to post release services. For those with longer terms we engage with programming.

**Case Management:** Regular group or personal reentry case management and planning focused on individual change, removing both barriers and adopting a new pro-social identity.

**Reentry planning:** Focus on enhancing motivation and change thinking.

**Refer:** Refer clients to other partner agencies in Mid Ohio Reentry Coalition.
